A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CAMERON'S

FIGHT...FLEE...STAND IN ALL CURCUMSTANCES, IN FAITH CALL ON JESUS

Typically, when people are frightened or in danger they have a "fight or flight" response. Their emotions and adrenalin are heightened. They will get ready for battle. If they are frightened for someone they care for or believe someone they love is in danger, it's not surprising to see them go into "Momma Bear" mode. They will do anything to protect their child or loved one.

Sometimes they avoid the threat and flee when frightened. This is not necessarily the best response either. Some dangers that frighten us need to be challenged. It's not always wise to run from the bully.

There is a 3rd response that I believe is more typical than "fight or flight" and that response is "freeze." When danger presents itself, instead of fighting or fleeing we do nothing – we just stand there. This "deer in the headlights" reaction is really inaction. Rather than confront the danger or get away from the danger, we remain susceptible to harm.

What's typical in our society isn't always smart nor God-pleasing. We pray in the Lord's Prayer, "deliver us from evil." Jesus knew that in this sin-filled world physical and spiritual dangers would be a part of our lives. He gives us another response to the perils in our life: Faith.

Faith and trust in Christ is our best response to the hazards we face. We trust that He is with us, is able to protect us, and will guide us. Like a Good Shepherd, as we walk through the valley of the shadow of death" **(Psalm 23:4)** we will fear no evil, because Jesus with us. That's faith facing fear.

The Good Shepherd may want us to fight (<u>Ephesians 6:10-18</u>), flee (<u>2 Timothy 2:22</u>) or stand (<u>Philippians 4:1</u>). Whatever our response to the evils from which Jesus will deliver us, we will do so with confident faith that He loves us and will be with us.



HELP THE GRIEVING

Our church sometimes hosts funeral receptions for members. RISEN SAVIOR'S GOING GREEN!

Stewardship – we are responsible for all God has given to us, and we are to be good stewards of it. One way we are doing that is by switching to a more cost-effective coffee (and vendor) that members rated as "better" than our current coffee. What else can we do?

REUSE/REPURPOSE: Why spend money on items that add to our landfill problem? Reusing items is our "greenest" solution.

WHAT CAN YOU DO? Use coffee/tea cups that can be washed and re-used.

WHAT IS RISEN SAVIOR DOING? Encouraging members to bring and take home your own travel cup each time you come to church.

RECYCLE: next best option is to use items that can be easily recycled/composted. Be a good steward of the world God has entrusted us with.

WHAT CAN YOU DO: Use "earth-friendly" cups when your cup/glass is not available. Take advantage of our current recycling programs at RSLC.

WHAT IS RSLC DOING? Switching to non-Styrofoam products that are less harmful to us and our environment. These will be available for everyone who didn't bring a cup, including guests, visitors, and those who forgot their cup.

Other areas that can be rolled into this campaign could be:

Using recycling bins at church for all recyclable products, such as bulletins Using church silverware vs. plastic utensils for smaller events

TRIANGLES

The triune God of the Bible reveals Himself in three persons. A *triangle* of characteristics reveals the mysteries of creation, redemption and sanctification for a full life. Here we see perfect power matched with love and comfort that is beyond reason, yet true.

Life involves many triangles. A three-legged stool balances anything set upon it. Ancient cultures built sacred buildings with triangular forms.

Our democratic constitutional government was built on the balance of three branches of authority; executive, legislative and judicial.

Emotional triangles govern relationships more than many recognize.

For example, in emotional triangles, when any two parts of an emotional system become uncomfortable with another, they will "triangle in" or focus upon a third person, or issue, as a way of stabilizing their own relationship with each other. Any unresolved relationships will often be played out in another relationship.

This is often a playground for Satan, but it also can be a way for the Body of Christ in the Fellowship of the Holy Spirit to provide balm that heals and binds what is broken.

Emotionally, we can only change a relationship to which we belong requiring a third person to maintain a well-defined relationship with each, while averting the responsibility for their relationship with one another. This tenant is also true for tasks that allow stewards to faithfully manage many gifts provided by God.

Many people fail to protect life's risks or to see the opportunity costs of decisions. Insurance can be an effective way to manage financial risks of loss, but the costs of relationship risks, or the opportunity cost of our decisions often remain unmanaged for many.

The LCMS Foundation helps people develop A 'Lifetime Plan for Giving' with a clear Statement of Faith, and discussion leading toward preparedness to have attorneys draft a Last Will and Testament, a Revocable Trust, plus Durable Powers of Attorney for Financial and Health Care. These can provide protection for loved ones letting them know you want them to flourish even when you're not here to help. As life swirls around us, a 'Lifetime Plan for Giving' can serve as a helpful triangle to allow our earthly management to remain more objective even about intense situations, protecting our position in helping. It's a way to be thoughtful and giving, as our God has created us to be.

The Cost of Salvation

In Luke 16, Jesus told a parable of the shrewd manager. At the end of the parable Jesus says, "I tell you, use worldly wealth to gain friends for yourselves, so that when it is gone, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings" (v. 9). My question is how much will it cost for one baptism? The answer: Jesus' death on the cross. In the month of May, New Hope Church in Neenah, Wisconsin did a campaign to raise funds for ten motorbikes for the Hmong pastors in Southeast Asia to use in their ministries. Pastor Jeff Prewitt delivered the funds to the Hmong pastors. Immediately, after the Hmong pastors returned to their home countries, they purchased the needed motorbikes and started using them for the Lord's Kingdom growth. The password is 5687. Salvation is a free gift because of what Christ has done on the cross. However, mission work is very expensive. How expensive is it? It costs Jesus life. Although, we rejoiced with the funds for the motorbikes for the Hmong pastors to do the Lord's work, our family has not yet received the full financial support we needed to continue to do the Lord's work in Southeast Asia. Currently, we reached only 82% of our fundraising goal. We pray and hope that as the Lord working through you, we will reach 100% of our fundraising goal by the end of this month. We want to thank you for your partnership in the Gospel, and for New Hope Church for raising the needed funds for the motorbikes.
