There is a danger to avoid in our lives that Ezekiel 12:2 speaks of: "Son of man, you dwell in the midst of a rebellious house, which has eyes to see but does not see, and ears to hear but does not hear; for they are a rebellious house."

A rebellious spirit is shown by our unwillingness to be aware - to see/to hear – the blessings that God gives to us.

"For He [God] makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." Matthew 5:45

Counting our blessings takes an intentional effort to see/hear the good that God sends into our lives. We can count the spiritual blessings: Christ's work of salvation for us, the Holy Spirit, God's Word, and so much more. Counting the everyday blessings that support our body and life gives us the resources to come to God in pray. As we pray, we can give thanks to Him for each thing on our list.

Pastor Phil Cameron Senior Pastor Psalm 23:4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me;

"Feel the fear...

and do it anyway!

A 34 year old felt the fear ... and did it anyway, nailing 95 Theses to the Wittenberg church door. His "95 Theses," which propounded two central beliefs—that the Bible is the central religious authority and that humans may reach salvation only by their faith and not by their deeds—was to spark the Protestant Reformation. Martin Luther faced his fear with faith in Christ.

A slightly built shepherd felt the fear ... and did it anyway. David killed his enemy, a giant named Goliath, with a sling, a few rocks, and faith in his God.

We all face fears, but will we do it anyway? Maybe it's that phone call that you've been dreading and putting off. Maybe it's that conversation with a family member who is self-sabotaging their life that you've been avoiding. Maybe it's dealing with the financial hole you've dug for yourself and now needs to be dealt with before the creditors start invading your life.

Our fears can come from our own self-sabotaging actions (or inaction).



They can come from others' actions (or inactions) when they cascade into our lives bringing problems and disasters with them. Whatever the source, we can learn to face our fears ... and continue by faith trusting that God is with us.

When Joseph, sold into slavery in Egypt by his own brothers, sitting in a jail cell (having been falsely accused) God was still with him. Nothing could separate Joseph (or us) from God's love. God was with him and will be with us.

David proclaims the truth that he, Joseph, Martin Luther, and all of us need to know and believe:

"Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me." Psalm 23:4

> Our Good Shepherd and Savior from sin, Jesus Christ, will be with us. Let's face our fears...and do it anyway.

What Do We Do With The Kids?

This is a struggle for families who want the Biblical community that our Connect and Bible groups provide. It was rarely a problem when church community happened organically, and we had enough dedicated volunteers to watch kids while parents attended Bible classes. But the pace of our current culture no longer leaves time for classes, much less time for impromptu, meaningful conversations with Christian friends. Is it enough for parents to make it to Sunday services and take a breather from groups at this crazy stage in life? How important are authentic, close friendships as we parent our children?

God designed us for relationships, so healthy, Christian friendships are not an option. We all need that. We set the tone and teach life lessons to our children by what we do. As the old adage says, "More is caught than taught." Christian parents are eager to see their kids forge healthy relationships with other kids. This becomes more pronounced as children move through adolescence. It's wise to model this value when the kids are small. A small group shows what it means to be brothers and sisters in Christ and what "family" is all about.

So, what do we do with the kids when we meet in our group? Here are a few suggestions:

No kids in the group – turn to family, friends, or a hired sitter to watch the kids.

Kids occasionally included in the group plan quarterly celebrations that include the kids.

Kids near the group – kids play in an adjoining room with a sitter.

Kids around the group – kids wander in and around the meeting space.

some questions are geared for the kids and they learn to pray for one another.

Kids essential to the group – curriculum is designed for families; kids fully participate in all aspects of the group, including hospitality, service, and discussion.

When groups are intentional in engaging the family, everything is arranged to reflect this. It's not always easy, but it's worth the effort.

RISEN SAVIOR'S GOING GREEN!

Stewardship – we are responsible for all God has given to us, and we are to be good stewards of it. One way we are doing that is by switching to a more cost-effective coffee (and vendor) that members rated as "better" than our current coffee. What else can we do?

REUSE/REPURPOSE: Why spend money on items that add to our landfill problem? Reusing items is our "greenest" solution.

WHAT CAN YOU DO? Use coffee/tea cups that can be washed and re-used.

WHAT IS RISEN SAVIOR DOING? Encouraging members to bring and take home your own travel cup each time you come to church.

RECYCLE: next best option is to use items that can be easily recycled/ composted. Be a good steward of the world God has entrusted us with.

Reforming Our Ways

John, the Baptist differentiated himself from Jesus, saying *"He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire."* John's purpose was to make straight the paths and encourage us to "Bear fruits in keeping with repentance." (Luke 3:8)

Similarly, St. Paul proclaimed that "God wants us to turn to God and perform deeds in keeping with our repentance." (Acts 26:20) Reforming our ways is not about outward alterations or a political viewpoint. Indeed, "God has granted repentance that leads to life!" (Acts 11:18)

Martin Luther and the reformers experienced intense personal reforming of their ways. God used them to unlock handcuffs that were slapped on the Gospel message. Jesus said in speaking about repentance, "Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance." (Luke 15:7) The reformers discovered the Jubilee of forgiveness, and it caught fire.



Many in our times equate God's kindness with prosperity, good looks, health or strong ability. However, if our ways aren't reformed in the heart, where sin emulates, then it's not likely to be a reformation that leads to Jubilee or eternal life. Paul asked the Romans, *"Do you not know that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?"* (Romans 2:4b).

Reforming our ways also brings godly sorrow. St. Paul, inspired by the Spirit of Christ, informs us, <u>"For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to</u> salvation without regret, whereas worldly grief produces death." (2 Cor. 7:10)

Is repentance reforming your ways? Jesus informs us, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance." (Luke 5:31-32) "...God is wishing that all should reach repentance" (2 Peter 3:9b)

When our ways are reformed by the Holy Spirit, we recognize our spiritual depravity before God. We then notice the things we manage are not ours, but we are only 'caretakers.' The implications to our lives, and for our loved ones, also reform. The way we plan to distribute the worldly wealth we manage for Him will characterize blessings rather than curses.
