CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

in preparation for Holy Communion

- L: Since it is our intention to come to the table of the Lord and there to receive the gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation in the very body and blood of Jesus Christ, it is proper for us to undergo the discipline of self-examination, that we may receive these gifts to our soul's health. I therefore ask you, do you confess that you have sinned against God and against others, and deserve nothing but punishment?
- C: I confess that I have sinned against God and against you, my brothers and sisters, in my thoughts, words, and actions.
- L: Do you believe that God, for the sake of His Son, Jesus Christ, forgives your sins, and removes them from you as far as the east is from the west?
- C: Yes, I do believe that for the sake of Jesus Christ, God fully and freely forgives all my sins.
- L: Do you desire the Holy Spirit of God to strengthen your faith, and to encourage you in your life as a child of God, that you may forsake your sinful ways?
- C: Yes, I ask God's Holy Spirit to help me to live as a child of God in every way.
- L: Do you believe that under the bread and wine of this holy Sacrament you receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of sin?
- C: Yes, I believe that the Lord's Supper is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins.
- L: Then may it be to you as you have confessed. As a servant of the Word, I announce the forgiveness of all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

SCRIPTURE READING Acts 8:26-40 26 Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place.²⁷ And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸ and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah.²⁹ And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." ³⁰ So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹ And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³² Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth.³³ In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth." ³⁴ And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵

Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶ And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" ³⁸ And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. ³⁹ And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰ But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

- **L:** This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING John 14:1-14 1 [Jesus said,] "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me.² In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also.⁴ And you know the way to where I am going.⁵ Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" ⁶ Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.⁷ If you had known me, you would have known my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him." ⁸ Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is enough for us." ⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰ Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹ Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves. ¹² "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.¹⁴ If you ask me anything in my name, I will do it."

- L: This is the Gospel of the Lord.
- C: Praise to You, O Christ.

APOSTLES' CREED

C: I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
