

A New Chapter

It is with great joy to share with you that our family is adjusting well to the cold winter weather in Minnesota. Upon our arrival on December 21st, we had to quarantine ourselves for fourteen days in our home prior to going anywhere. It was good that we have our daughter and sonin-law running errands for us. We used the time to get things organized and ready for us to start doing the Lord's work from the US. We are thankful for Good Shepard Lutheran Church in Circle Pines, Minnesota for graciously giving us an office space so we can stay focused on doing the Lord's work. In addition to putting things together, we hosted a theological training online with three Hmong congregations in Southeast Asia. However, after two days of training, the police came to investigate one of the groups, so we had to temporarily discontinue the training with the other groups. It was a blessing we finished the training with the other two groups, with a total of 30 people. We are asking you to keep our Hmong brothers and sisters in Southeast Asia in our prayers. Many of them are still facing persecution for being Christians and for meeting together to study the word of God. Yet, they are willing to risk their lives and safety for the opportunities to learn. Furthermore, most of the congregations we are working with are lacking many things like tables, chairs, Bibles and church buildings for their ministries.
