HOW TO REGISTER?

MUST PRE-REGISTER online at [rsic.org](https://www.rsic.org) (CDC requirement for VBS)

WHEN? **REGISTRATION DEADLINE Tuesday, June 1st!**

Maximum number of children is 24. (CDC spacing requirement)

WHAT IF I'LL BE GONE? Since your child is holding his/her place as a registered participant, please have them attend all summer. It's okay if they will miss a couple weeks, but please leave the place for another child if they will not attend regularly.

WHAT MATERIALS? Group Publishing's Rocky Railway! Songs, Bible adventure books, crafts, projects, games, videos! A Christian message of HOPE in JESUS' POWER, and a special chance for children to interact and share with others.

COST? FREE! Donations can be made toward the Operation Kid-to-Kid mission project. See flyer.

T-SHIRTS: Each register child will receive one free T-Shirt that he/she can wear all summer for VBS!

WATER & SNACKS: Your child will receive one new bottled water every time we meet for VBS. There will be individually packaged snacks only 3 times throughout the summer. If your child has an **allergy or dietary concern** that would prohibit them from eating this snack, please make sure it is indicated in the online registration. Also, contact Lori Hakes about an alternative snack for your child.

Wellness Policy

At **Risen Savior Lutheran Church**, we strive to provide a healthy environment for all and ask those experiencing symptoms of communicable illnesses refrain from in-person activities.

Due to COVID19, we can't emphasize enough the importance of following our wellness policy. If in the last 14 days, you or someone you are bringing, have been told to quarantine by a medical or government official, had a fever, or a persistent dry cough or shortness of breath, we ask that you please stay home. We appreciate your care and consideration for others.

If you or one of your children are experiencing *any of these symptoms of* communicable illnesses, we ask that you to please *keep them at home*.

CDC Indoor Spacing

We have a maximum number of people allowed in the Wing 1 space. We can only have 24 children plus up to 6 helpers in that space. We will most often have only half that number of children in that space, while other half is outside or in Wing 2.

Masks & Social Distancing

For now, every person will wear a mask indoors. Guidelines fluctuate and we may adjust as the summer goes on. We will wear masks outdoors if in close contact with each other. We cannot guarantee Social Distancing, but will

We will spend time outside when possible. We will open the doors and windows for increased ventilation when possible. Please apply sunscreen **at home**.

Supplies & Hand Washing

Most of the time we will use individual supplies and individually packaged snacks when possible. If any supplies are shared at a station, we will wash hands before moving to the next station (may happen with games, for example).


